THE PANEL INTERVIEW

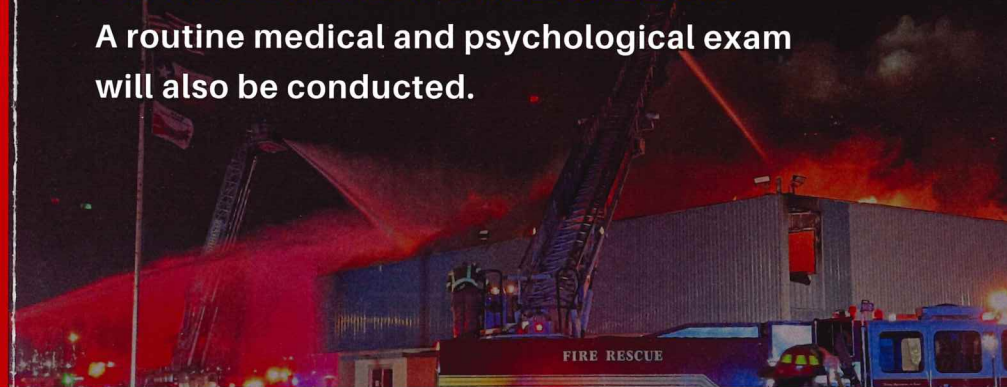
A panel of three people will determine your suitability for employment. They will also answer any questions you may have about the position.

OUR TRAINING ACADEMY

The Academy consists of over 700 hours of instruction in firefighting tactics and safety.

An additional 1,400 hours of medical training is provided, which results in certification as a:

- Certified Firefighter
- Certified Paramedic



SHIFT HOURS

Once a cadet graduates, he/she is assigned to shift duty. Shifts consist of one 24-hour shift with 48 hours off.



SALARY

Upon completion of the Academy, a first-year firefighter will earn between \$55,656 - \$66,192 annually.

Upon graduation, the City pays the cost of the initial issue uniform. Thereafter, a \$67.50 monthly clothing allowance is issued.

LONGEVITY & EDUCATION PAY

The Corpus Christi Fire Department offers longevity pay for each year of service. Firefighters will also receive additional pay for college hours towards accredited degrees.

MONTHLY CERTIFICATION PAY

Upon completion of the Academy:

Fire: \$50 - \$125

EMT: \$35

Paramedic: \$100

Fire Inspector: \$35

Instructor: \$35 - \$75

Haz-Mat/Rescue: \$125

Arson Investigator: \$75

Ambulance Assignment: \$25 - \$250



BENEFITS & RETIREMENT

Annually, Corpus Christi firefighters receive 15 days of sick leave, 15 days of vacation and 10 paid holidays. The City provides health and life insurance coverage for employees and pays 50% of dependent coverage.

Trainees immediately begin participation in the Corpus Christi Firefighters Retirement System.
