Kilgore College held a press conference Jan. 31 to officially announce its collaboration with technologists from Amazon Web Services (AWS) Skills to better align the college's tech programs to industry.

This collaboration addresses the skills gap in community college and university curricula to better reflect industry needs and prepare learners for careers in areas such as IT/cloud support, software development, and data analysis.

As part of this effort, our faculty works closely with AWS experts on a regular basis to plan Business and Information Technology classes, build realistic project work, and create a high-quality education experience for our students.

This collaborative approach to our programming strengthens student career readiness and equips learners with in-demand skills that open pathways to entry-level tech roles in a rapidly-evolving job market. *READ MORE*

I posed several questions to you during my comments at our January convocation. I asked you: How will we meet the ever-evolving expectations of our Gen Z & A student population? How do we attract those, as well as other populations, to our organization? How do we keep pace with students' ever-evolving perceptions about post-secondary education?

The answer to all of these questions is IMAGINE.

We already have a blueprint in place for accomplishing herculean tasks at Kilgore College, which we followed to put our 8-week terms into existence. Utilizing that exact blueprint, I believe we can achieve anything we set our sights on....anything that we can IMAGINE.

Similar to the blueprint established for our 8-week conversion, we will employ a steering committee, have regular steering committee and workgroup meetings, and tap into our collective brain trust to shift what we see in our imagination into action and a new reality for our current students and those students yet to come.

Imagining the KC Student Experience is going to take a lot of work. We've heard from other colleges who have undertaken this level of transformation, and it is a process that can easily span 18-24 months.
