KC Public Services will host 9/11 Ceremony Sept. 11

Kilgore College Public Services (Fire, Police and EMS) will host a combined "Honor, Respect and Never Forget Ceremony" in remembrance of those who lost their lives on Sept. 11, 2001.

The ceremony is set for 8:46 a.m. Wednesday, Sept. 11, at the Woodruff Adult Education Center.

The time of 8:46 a.m. is in remembrance of the approximate time that the first airplane crashed into the World Trade Center in New York City in 2001.

There will be speakers at the event and it will conclude with a tribute to the 343 firefighters who lost their lives with a traditional "engine push-in" and dedication of a fire truck (Engine No. 2) purchased by the college. Chief Eric Greaser, Smith County Fire Chief, and KCFA class No. 9 alumni will be present with others from Smith County Emergency Services District No. 2 to help with the push-in.



- **Civilian of the Year:** Kenneth Struggs, Campus Safety Officer



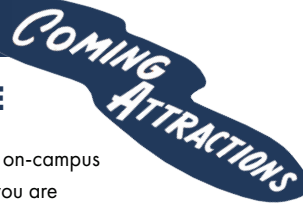

To cap off the day, the Rangers will face Christian Community College, 3 p.m. R.E. St. John Memorial Stadium.

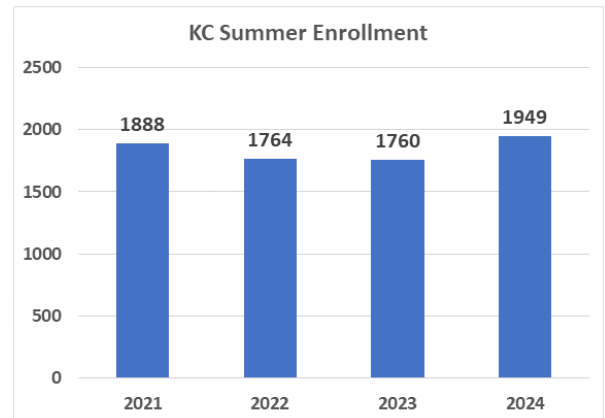

It consists of a large driving training track, multi-classroom facility and warehouse training building as part of a major expansion of the college's CDL training program.

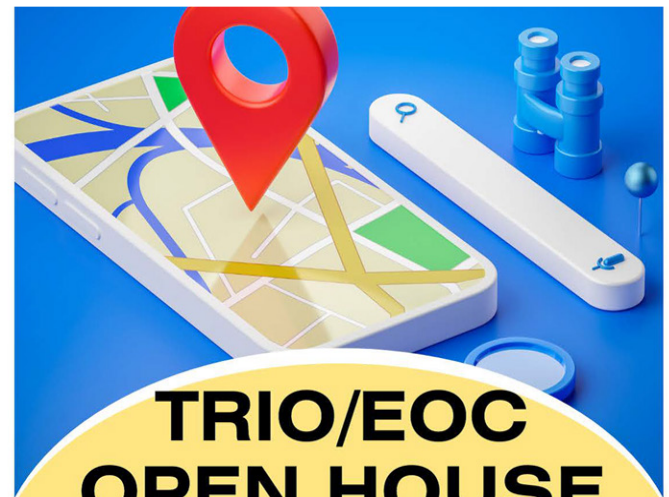
