Applicants are encouraged to "think outside the box!"

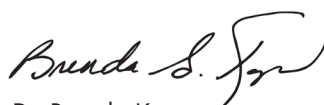

KC boasts record enrollment, STAR Days scheduled



This semester, KC celebrated record-breaking enrollment of 7,288 students -- a testament to the college's strategic planning and its ability to attract and retain students through exceptional academic and workforce offerings, state-of-the-art facilities and a supportive campus culture.

KC also had an 11% increase in the total number of credit hours being taken this semester, compared to the same time last year -- and a 36% increase of dual credit students since the last academic year.

KC receives \$350K grant from ATE/NSF to boost IT technician education

Kilgore College has received a \$349,818 Advanced Technological Education (ATE) grant from the National Science Foundation to fund its "Reducing Barriers to IT Technician Education" (RBITTE) initiative.

The three-year grant will support efforts to increase the number of employable IT technicians in the region by addressing barriers to completion in the Computer Information Technology (CIT) program, expanding industry partnerships, implementing flexible course delivery and boosting student support.

"We are thrilled to receive our first ATE grant," said Dr. Brenda Kays, KC president. "This project aligns with our strategic goals and addresses the needs of regional employers for skilled IT technicians." [MORE](#)

Darden named fellow of national STEM leadership program

Danny Darden, a professor of Computer and Information Technology at Kilgore College, has been selected as a member of the 2024-25 Fellows of The Community College Presidents Initiative in STEM (CCPI-STEM) project -- funded by The National Science Foundation.
