## KC will celebrate 90th Anniversary with ceremony set for Sept. 15

KC will celebrate its 90th anniversary with a community ceremony at 9 a.m. Monday, Sept. 15, on the west side of the Pedestrian Bridge on campus.

The program will include remarks from Kilgore College leaders, city and county officials, and Rangerette officers. Attendees will also hear musical selections from KC Connection, highlighting the role of music and the arts in the college's history.

Since its founding, the institution has grown into a hub for higher education, innovation, and community engagement, while remaining dedicated to its original mission of making education accessible to students of all backgrounds.

The 90th anniversary ceremony will not only reflect on the college's beginnings during the 1930s but will also highlight its ongoing contributions to the region and its vision for the future.



# **Berry named Dean of Students**

Kilgore College has announced the appointment of Amanda Berry as its new dean of students.

In her role, Berry will provide leadership for student conduct, athletics, campus life and student activities.

She will work with faculty, staff and students to support a safe, inclusive and engaging campus environment.

Berry also worked for more than seven years at Murray State College, where she gained broad experience in student services and higher education leadership.



During our Fall Convocation, I announced that our innovation grants would return for the 2025-26 school year. The KC Board of Trustees has approved a set-aside of \$60,000 to foster innovative ideas at KC. The fillable KC Innovation Grant form is now available. The only "catch" associated with the grant is that interested faculty/staff members must complete a grant application to apply!

The Innovation Grant application is relatively simple to complete and may be accessed by following the steps:

- Visit AccessKC
- Go to "employees"
- On the left-hand side of the screen, under quick links, you will find the "Innovation Grant Application"

Now is your chance to receive some "seed money" to fund your great idea, benefit our students and continue to move us forward as a college! Grant awards may go to one or multiple applicants.

There is no application minimum or maximum, but KC will not award more than \$60,000. The Innovation Committee will select the grant recipients and look for applicants who propose new methods and ideas to improve efficiency and effectiveness. Applicants are encouraged to "think outside the box!" Get your creative juices flowing now, as there are some important dates to note.

The application deadline is Oct. 10. Awards will be announced no later than Nov. 7, and must be expended during the College's fiscal year ending Aug. 31, 2026. Awardees will be asked to do a short presentation during a KC Board of Trustees meeting next spring.

What project do you want to launch to benefit our students? Contact me with any questions. I hope your semester is off to a great start, and I look forward to reading about your innovative ideas. The Innovation Committee will select the recipients of these grant dollars, so don't wait—apply now! Together, let's create a culture where innovation thrives and where the success of our students remains at the heart of everything we do.

### CIT faculty host course design workshop

Stephens, hosted a four-day intensive workshop May
12–15, focused on



course design and development.

The workshop provided training on best practices for addressing challenges in online and HyFlex learning, including strategies for content delivery, student engagement and assessment. Faculty also collaborated on program improvements such as integrating industry certification preparation, creating an IT Professional Expectations guide and developing digital badging opportunities for students.

The event was supported by the college's National Science Foundation ATE grant, Reducing Barriers to IT Technician Education (RBITTE). The grant's acronym, pronounced "ribbit," inspired faculty to adopt a beaniebelly frog as the workshop mascot.


# **HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE brings the 90s back for CONVOCATION**
